Learners need to question. discuss and critically weigh and select what knowledge they want to take in.

This is the scenario in which teachers have to become learners. First of all, they need to learn that knowledge base in today's world is fast changing and evolving. And even teachers, they just cannot 'know all', therefore knowing something is nothing to be ashamed of. In fact, in many situations, learners know more than what their teachers know, as they are quick to manipulate digital tools and have varied sources of knowledge on their fingertips. When learners question teachers on what doesn't make sense to them, teachers have to learn not to feel threatened, or consider learners disrespectful, and disruptive. Once teachers come down from the high pedestal of knowing all, and also see the questioning as a form of learning, they can learn along with their learners. This will make the teaching learning process much more effective and fun too in the bargain!
