Commencement of Virtual Academic Sessions

SPELT Abbottabad Chapter has a tradition of holding monthly academic sessions on various ELT topics for English language teachers in four cities of Hazara, namely Haripur, Havelian, Abbottabad and Mansehra. However, the practice had to be discontinued during the first wave of COVID-19. During the second wave, the Working Committee decided to launch online meetings of English language teachers as a response to COVID-19 crisis. In this connection, Programme Coordinator Ms. Shagufta Aamer held the first academic



session on 28th November 2020 on the topic "COVID-19: Meet the New YOU!".
