SPELT Goes to HHS School System



On April 26, 2025, SPELT, in collaboration with the HHS School System, organised an interactive, hands-on workshop titled "AI Beyond the Teaching Assistant", facilitated by Mr. Nooruddin Merchant (Assistant Director, Library and Educational Programs), an experienced educator and technology integration expert. Held in a well-equipped computer lab, the session was attended by around 65 middle and high school teachers teaching a variety of subjects, administrators, and school leaders.

The workshop emphasised AI literacy as a vital digital competency for 21st-century classrooms. Participants were introduced to advanced AI tools, exploring practical ways to use AI for boosting student engagement, creating personalized learning experiences, and even building custom chatbots. The hands-on methodology allowed attendees to directly experiment with these tools and reflect on their classroom relevance.

Mr. Merchant brought in his wealth of experience from the education and technology sectors to lead the session with clarity, practical insights, and thought-provoking ideas.

SPELT extends its gratitude to the HHS School System for its valuable collaboration, especially acknowledging Dr. Maliha Ahmed (Director Programs, HHS Schooling System) and her team for their coordination and support in making this session a success.

Global ELT News IATEFL Annual Conference 2025

Report by Professor Zakia Sarwar, Patron In-Chief, SPELT



The 58th IATEFL Annual Conference was held from 7-11 April 2025, in the stunning city of Edinburgh, where the famous "One Mile Walk" -the old cobbled road is replete with historic engravings of events that took place there. The conference was a grand event, bubbling with enthusiasm about the immense possibilities that AI offers to the ELT practitioners in all fields. of teaching, learning and research. In the majority of the sessions I attended, presenters made an effort to harness AI as an "aid" to students' quick learning, but at the same time, sharpening their autonomous learning, and critical thinking skills.

The conference was spread over four days with rich inputs from well-known ELT professionals to the first time presenters, in simultaneous sessions in 20 rooms. There were 5 reflective and thought provoking plenaries on a variety of topics such as " 50 years on: what has changed? Examining the similarities and differences between then and now, and questioning what lessons can be learnt from it", presented by Catherine Walter. Interestingly, the next day's plenary was titled," Lessons Learnt: using the science of learning to inform teaching" by Carolina Kuepper-Telzel. So the focus has moved from teacher-centred classroom to learner being on centre-stage. (Are SPELTers aiming to get there?) Another plenary by Daniel Xerri addressed the issue of "Teachers and classroom ownership, relevance and conceptualisations". He explored the reasons why teachers find it difficult to do research. He looked at ways in which teachers can be empowered to gain ownership if they are able to understand what classroom research really envisions, because it actually implies that teachers are owners of the research process on their own terms , for their professional needs and in ways that are relevant to their contexts, learners and their classroom practices.

SPELT was represented at the Associates Day by this author, on the topic "Sharing Action Research in Progress on Writing and Oral Interaction" It is a teacher-initiated, non-funded international project in which teachers from six countries --Bangladesh, China, Malaysia, Nepal, Pakistan and Russia -- are participating and have finished the first phase of their classroom research. Also, holding five simultaneous conferences successfully in the same city to celebrate SPELT's 40th Anniversary was shared with the delegates. It was encouraging to note that a lot of delegates knew about SPELT because of the success story of SPELT's Travelling Conferences in the British Council/ IATEFL publication (Sarwar: 2011 pp 69-76).

Delegates from different Associations shared either their academic programme or projects they were running, or how they solved problems and issues of inclusiveness, communication, membership retention and other such issues which most organizations face. These were labelled as 'TED Talks'.

However, the highlight of the Associates Day was the "Networking Event" on the topic "How can Associations find and generate funding?" The interesting tool used was SWOT analysis. The attendees were first divided into four major groups for Strengths, Weaknesses, Threats and Opportunities which were further subdivided into smaller groups to develop questions for the 4 sections . Jean Thuema , IATEFL Associates' Representative, has followed up the event by summarizing and making it into a viable working session for Associates to look at and use to focus more clearly on the financial issues of the association, if needed. This was the greatest take away from the Associates' Day and will be shared with the CEC & the SPELT finance team to lead a session / retreat to work on SPELT's financial issues.

The Associates Day was a fun filled but gainfully busy day professionally, attended by over 60 delegates from about 40 different ELT Associations worldwide. A real academic and professional treat and a memorable day!
