The press conference was held on 16th July 2021 to introduce SPELT current programs and its future plans, and was attended by SPELT friends from across Pakistan and internationally.




Panel Discussion


The topic of the panel discussion' held virtually on 17th July 2021, was "Teaching and Researching English in Difficult Circumstances". It was based around the major themes in 2 books as follows:

- 1. Bailey, K.M. and Christian, D. (eds). (2021). *Research on Teaching and Learning English in Under*resourced Contexts. Routledge and TIRF.
- 2. Kuchaah, H. and Shamim, F. (eds). (2018). *Teaching English in Difficult Circumstances*. Palgrave/Mcmillan.

The aim was to bring these resources to the attention of SPELT members as well as other ELT professional

working in 'difficult' or under-resourced contexts around the world.

Moderator: Prof Zakia Sarwar, SPELT

The discussion started with a brief introduction by the moderator, Prof Zakia Sarwar. She outlined the importance of the theme of the panel discussion for participants in Pakistan and ELT professionals elsewhere in similar contexts. She explained that the presentations will be divided into two parts; each part will be led by the contributors of the book under discussion. Finally, the participants will have the opportunity to ask questions in the Q/A session.

Prof Bailey, co-editor with Donna Christian of Research on Teaching and Learning English in Under-resourced Contexts, shared an overview of the book and highlighted some issues arising/questions for discussion. Next, Prof Andy Curtis talked about the definition of 'Under-Resourced Contexts" and presented a framework based on Maslow's hierarchy of needs to analyze contexts as situated and diverse- something that is not captured in the commonly used terms such as' developed' and 'developing' countries to describe these



Kathleen M. Bailey is a Professor of Applied Linguistics at the Middlebury Institute of International Studies at Monterey (MIIS). She served as the president of TESOL and the American Association for Applied Linguistics. Since 2009 she has been the President of TIRE Along with Ryan Damerow, she is the series editor for "Global Research on Teaching and Learning English" (co-published by Routledge Taylor Francis and TIRF).



Andy Curtis served as the 50th President of the TESOL International Association from 2015-16. He is a Professor in the Graduate School of Education at Anaheim University. he is currently at the forefront of the New Peace Linguistics field, and Virtual Reality in Language Education. He is based in Ontario, Canada.



Özgür Şahan is an Assistant Professor of Applied Linguistics at Yozgat Bozok University, Faculty of Education, Turkey. He is a recipient of a 2017 TIRF Doctoral Dissertation Grant. His research interests include language assessment, teacher education, and English-medium instruction.



Eauzia Shamim is a Professor and Dean, Faculty of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences at Ziauddin University, Karachi, Pakistan. She is a founder member and Vice President of the Society of Pakistan English Language Teachers (SPELT); she was Chair of TESOL's Research Professional Council (2018-19). Dr. Shamim teaches and researches EFL/ESL and

Applied Linguistics, and trains NNESTs in a variety of settings in Pakistan and internationally.



Prem Phyak teaches at the Department of English at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. His research interests include language policy, multilingualism, teacher education, and critical pedagogy. He has published articles in journals such as Language Policy, Language in Society, Critical Inquiry in Language Studies, and Multilingua.



Darío Luis Banegas is Lecturer in TESOL at the School of Education, University of Strathclyde, UK. He is actively involved in teacher associations in Latin America and the UK. His main areas of interest are: action research, teacher preparation, and social justice in language education.

contexts. Dr Ozgur from Turkey followed by sharing the major findings of his research on the challenges faced by novice EFL teachers in under resourced contexts in Turkey.

Part II began with Dr Shamim's presentation, co-editor with Kuchah Kuchah of *Teaching English in Difficult Circumstances*. She gave an overview of the book and highlighted some questions addressed by



nationally and internationally as a seasoned ELT expert and educationist, with many honours to her credit. She is a mover and a shaker. The endearing term that SPELIErs have given her is "Mother SPELI" which reflects her consistent role as a mentoring Founder member. She has put Pakistan on the ELT map of the world, and today SPELT is known as a model Teacher Association in our region and held in high esteem by international Teacher Associations such as TESOL and AITEFL. Through SPELT, she has established that language teaching – especially English Language Teaching – requires specialized training for effective teaching learning outcomes.

different contributors in their book chapters. She was followed by two contributing authors, Dario Benegas and Prem Pyhak, who shared the major findings of their research conducted in contexts of confinement in Argentina and school classrooms in Nepal respectively.

The discussion was concluded with comments from Prof Hywel Coleman, joining from Indonesia. He shared his recent experience of difficult circumstances in Afghanistan, where English teachers attended his professional development workshops with sounds of bomb blasts around them. He was happy to note that during the last 30 years or so, since he started work on teaching English in large classes, the definition of 'difficult circumstances' has been extended to include, for example, contexts of confinement, refugee camps and special education, as well as 'contexts within contexts', as represented in different chapters of the two books under discussion.

At the end Prof Zakia Sarwar thanked all the participants, panelists and Prof Hywel Coleman, as her 'guru and that of many others in SPELT.

It was heartening to note that English teachers and ELT professionals had joined the panel discussion from several countries around the globe including Argentina, Australia, Bangladesh, Canada, China (Hong Kong), England, Indonesia, Nepal, Scotland, Sri Lanka, Turkey, the US, and of course, Pakistan. Audience engagement was evident in the very interesting conversations going on between the panelists and the participants in the chat box throughout and their questions shared at the end.
